2. STAFFING

Since Christmas there has been much change in staffing! Mrs Ttaris (Class Teacher) left Year 1 at the end of Term 3 and Miss Chiarletti joined us to support Year 1. In fact she was meant to have a week long hand over with Mrs Ttaris before half term but Mrs Ttaris caught Covid; therefore Miss Chiarletti was thrown into the fire and taught the class for the week instead! No handover! She has been amazing!

Miss Styles (TA) left Year R at Christmas and we recruited Mrs Turner - 3 days week to work in Year R. She is a trained teacher who wanted to return to work in a voluntary fashion, but we snapped her up!

Mrs Snow (TA) left Year 5 in January due to family commitments. Mrs Merry (TA) left us at the start of Term 4 and her replacement was Mrs Reynolds.

Miss Taylor (1:1) TA left at the end of Term 3 to support her own business and her replacement is Mrs Hamilton who was already a midday meal supervisor but has now been recruited as a TA.

Mr Waterson (caretaker) has been recruited 5 hours a week mid-way through term 4 and has been a blooming marvel already!

Mrs Dyer (TA moved from supporting Year 5 to supporting Year R) at Christmas.

3. TEACHING & LEARNING STANDARDS

Learning Walks in Foundation Subjects that had been cancelled due to Covid before Christmas were completed. All Performance Management observations (except Miss Chiarletti) took place in Terms 3 and 4. SEN learning walk was undertaken by Mrs Heasman (SENCo) and Mr Edwards (SEN Governor). Chris Jacobs (our SIA) visited in March. Headteacher heard the bottom 20% of readers in every class in Term 3. Pupil Progress Meetings in Term 3 took place.

9. BUILDINGS & GROUNDS

Moles! Moles! Moles! We are trying to eradicate them again! New Caretaker started in term 4 (5 hours a week) Mr Waterson. Landscaping and gardening contractors are doing a great job! Jac has a skip and Year 6 helped to tidy the site!

10. Governors

Mr Radu Tandraescu stepped down in January. We recruited Luisa Saunders and Joti Sahota in Term 3. The governing body have once again undertaken a huge amount of training and monitoring in school.

11. Sports Premium

Over £17,000 continues to ensure that PE, Sport & Health have a high priority at Cobham. This funding allows us to ensure that Premier Sports continue to be part of the PE curriculum. We have had additional support

from them for our friendship clubs to be held at lunchtimes. Bounce in Term 3 and 4. Body surf board lessons were very popular in Term 3 as were the 'Life' workshops that were delivered which focused on Fitness, Mental Health and Well-being and Healthy Eating!

12. Pupil Premium

Sensory Circuit sessions continue for some of our children at the start of each day with their class TA. We have renewed our contract with Speech and Language support through the GLP and this means regular visits from an expert who not only assesses the children, but gives excellent advice on how we can cater for their specific needs. Jasmine (SLT) made a visit early in Term 3- children and teams were provided with plans and exercises to support them in this area. She was also commissioned to undertake an assessment and provide a report for the purposes of seeking a diagnosis for a child.

We are also providing Play Therapy for two Year 5 pupils - one is PP and the other is SEN and the cost of this is supported by us. One finished the course of sessions in Term 3 and the other carried on with a few more sessions.

13. Safeguarding -

Since September Jan 22, we have written 13 green safeguarding forms. 11 out of 13 details on the forms were shared with the parents via email or a telephone call. 3 were met with in person as parents requested meetings. The 2 not shared are being monitored. 3 are on the waiting list for Time to Talk which will resume in Term 6. 1 family has been referred to Walk Tall. 1 family was offered the support of Early Help - but has refused. Another is to be offered Early Help support in a meeting this week. 1 family benefited from Early help support after an Operation Encompass notification.
